In Roses...

- **‘Eau de Parfum Series’** – Delightful old fashioned rose series with heavy fragrance and the classic “quartered” English rose look. Available in a few colors (Blush and Bling in 2023) with more coming for sure. Perfect for growing in sunny garden spots and cutting for bouquets. Excellent disease resistance. Grows to about 4’ tall. Zone 5.
- **Emily Bronte** – Great rose from David Austin with soft apricot to cream blossoms all summer until frost. Disease resistant for sunny gardens, and great cut flower too. Strong old rose fragrance. Grows to about 4’ tall. Zone 5 on own roots.
- **‘Flower Carpet Mini Cherry’** – The newest member of the Flower Carpet series. These are perfect for pots or low borders with bright little double red flowers all summer until frost. Grows to under 2’ tall and spreads, and has excellent disease resistance in sun. Self dead-heading flowers – just prune in back once a year in late winter and off it goes! Zone 5.
- **Heavenly Scented** – A sweet new Hybrid Tea rose, repeat blooming with large salmon pink flowers perfect for cutting or just admiring in the yard. Strong fruity citrus fragrance and excellent disease resistance. Tall and upright habit. Grow in full sun. Zone 5.
- **Miniature Roses** – They are back @ Sunnyside! These provide long summer bloom for patio pots and small spaces in sunny gardens. Easy to grow and even easier to enjoy in the garden. Keep them deadheading and fed and they will keep the color coming. Ask our knowledgeable staff for help on these!
- **Morning Glow** – Gorgeous new Floribunda rose with soft golden yellow flowers and moderate tea rose scent. Excellent for sunny landscape color and will bloom all summer until frost. Excellent disease resistance and bushy habit to about 4’. Zone 6.
- **Picture Perfect** – Unique new Hybrid Tea introduction with fuchsia pink color and a white reverse. These will bloom all summer in sunshine and offer a nice moderate tea rose fragrance. Good for cutting and disease resistant. Grows more tall and upright. Zone 6.
- **Raspberry Cupcake** – Cool new Hybrid Tea rose with purplish pink color and strong raspberry lemon fragrance. Great cut flower to grow in a sunny spot in the landscape. Disease resistant and easy to grow. Grows bushy to 4’ tall. Zone 6.
- **‘Seaside Swirl Series’** – Excellent new hybrid Rugosa rose series introduced from Monrovia Growers available in red, pink and blush color options. These are super hardy and free of disease, blooming all summer through fall. Good fragrance and salt tolerant. Tidier growth to 3’ tall than other Rugosa roses. Attractive hips after flowers. Zone 3.
- **Silas Mariner** – Another fabulous rose from David Austin sporting warm pink blooms with strong old rose scent. Perfect for cutting or enjoying in the garden. Grows best in sun and comes on own root for increased hardiness. Grows to about 4’ tall. Disease resistant. Zone 4.
- **Sultry Night** – Useful new shrub rose with magenta purple color and moderate grapefruit scent. Nice bushy habit, roughly 4’ tall in sun and disease resistant. Great low maintenance option for all summer color until frost. Zone 4.
- **Top Cream** – New Hybrid Tea rose with old fashioned rose look - creamy color and light pink accents. Strong fruity fragrance all summer until frost, are perfect for cutting or enjoying outside. Best in full sun. Grows to 6’ tall. Zone 6.

- **Tree Roses** – They are back @ Sunnyside! Need some summer color in a sunny garden or container that provides height? Fragrance and cutting flowers for vases? A 36” tall rose tree that will fit the bill. Be sure to protect the grafts in cold winter spells to ensure hardiness. Ask our knowledgeable staff for help!
- **Uptown Girl** – Excellent new Grandiflora rose (GR) with coral pink color and pleasing moderate spicy fruit fragrance. Best in sun and will repeat flower all summer until frost. Grows upright to about 5’ and has excellent disease resistance. Zone 4.
- **Vanessa Bell** – A noteworthy rose from David Austin with delicious pale yellow and strong tea rose fragrance. Disease resistant and great color from summer until frost. Good for cutting and enjoying outdoors. Grows to about 4’ tall. Zone 5 on own roots.

In Trees...

- **Acer griseum ‘Copper Rocket’** – New variety of paperbark maple, growing is tidy and columnar for the landscape, growing 25’ tall and 12’ wide. Nice clean foliage, gorgeous red fall color, and exfoliating coppery bark in winter months. A great year ‘round tree. Zone 5.
- **Acer palmatum ‘Baton Rouge’** – Japanese maple growing to 15’ tall and 12’ wide. Spring foliage is bright green with red tips. Fall colors range in the yellow to red tones. Great for sun or part shade in well drained gardens. New semi-dwarf Coral Bark type maple. Zone 6.
- **Acer palmatum ‘Corvallis Broom’** – Awesome new dwarf multi-stemmed Coral bark type Japanese Maple growing only 6’ tall or so and 4’ wide. Perfect for sunny small gardens with good drainage and container growing. Spring foliage is bright green, fall color yellow with red. Zone 6.
- **Acer palmatum ‘Koto Maru’** - More available now, this excellent dwarf bushy grower stays about 4’ tall x 5’ wide. Bright yellow green with orange red tips adds color in spring. Mixed fall colors, one of best we have seen. Outstanding dwarf and suitable for small landscapes, containers and bonsai as well. Good drainage please! Zone 5.
- **Acer palmatum ‘Mini Maple’** - This one deserves a return to the list and is finally more available in 2023! Grows only 2’ wide and tall from seed – no graft! Green with red color in spring followed by bright red orange fall color. Awesome miniature for containers and bonsai, a must have for any lover of Japanese Maples. Zone 6.
- **Acer palmatum ‘Nebula’** – Another striking reticulated (variegated) Japanese Maple for part shade/morning sun. Grows about 8’ tall and 6’ wide. Spring color is peachy pink/white on top of green, summer two toned green, and in fall mainly scarlet red with orange/yellow highlights. Very nice foliage on this one. Zone 6.
- **Acer palmatum ‘Wildfire’** – Excellent Coral Bark option with improved shape and tidier size. Grows to about 15’ tall and 12’ wide. Bright green spring foliage is followed by orangey yellow fall color. Best in full sun and good drainage. Bark will range from yellow to coral red in color. Zone 6.
- **Acer x pal ‘Wabi sabi’** - Interesting Pacific Rim maple from Iseli Nursery with spectacular weeping habit and character. Best in full and good drainage and grows to about 7’ tall and 10’ wide in the garden. Bright green in spring turning spectacular shades of red/yellow/orange in fall. Showy red seeds point up to add interest, white color to bark adds interest as well. Zone 5.
- **Acer x pal ‘Origami’** – Fabulous Pacific Rim maple from Iseli perfect for small gardens and container growing. Best in full sun or part shade with good drainage and grows about 8’ tall and wide with a bushy upright habit. Lime green color in spring followed by orange/yellow color tones in the fall. Great form and interesting two tone green foliage in summer months in nice. Zone 5.

- **Cercis canadensis ‘Golden Falls’** – Gorgeous weeping redbud variety with excellent foliage color. Blooms are lavender pink in early spring and show well on bare branches. Heart-shaped foliage emerges next with orangey yellow color in spring. Limey gold color persists all summer and finally golden orange fall color. Grows best to 10’ tall and 4’ wide in sun, super hardy and drought tolerant. Zone 5.
- **Cornus kousa ‘Blue Ray’** – Newer Korean Dogwood with nice blue green foliage and plentiful white flowers. Grows best in sun or part shade to 20’ tall and wide. Blooms late spring to early summer and produces small red fruits in fall for the birds. Scarlet red fall color. Super disease resistant. Tolerant of heavier soils and easy to grow. Zone 5.
- **Cornus mas ‘Saffron Sentinel’** - Beautiful new Cornelian Cherry variety with nice columnar tidy for the modern garden. Grows to about 20’ tall and 12’ wide with age. Nice early spring yellow blooms followed by edible fruits in late summer and fall. Reddish purple fall foliage. Super hardy and easy to grow in sun or part shade. Zone 4.
- **Magnolia ‘Sunsation’** – Interesting mid spring bloomer with unique large 7” tulip flowers golden yellow flushed with some pink at base. Upright growth to 25’ tall and only 10’ wide. Large green foliage all summer and yellow fall color. Best in sun with good drainage. Zone 5.
- **Styrax japonica ‘Nightfall’** – Awesome new Japanese Snowbell selection with weeping character and dark purple foliage. Best grown in full sun for darkest foliage color. Forms mounding habit about 8’ tall and 6’ wide but can be pruned or trained. Fragrant white flowers emerge along branches in mid-late spring. Bronzy yellow fall color. Zone 5.

In Shrubs...

- **Abelia chinensis ‘Raspberry Perfection’** – New Abelia with nice bloom, foliage and growth habit. Best in full sun and useful as foundation plants or sunny specimen. Grows to about 4’ tall and wide and requires much less pruning than others to keep tidy. Evergreen but may lose a few leaves in colder winters. Tons of pink blossoms start in summer and go through fall. Zone 6.
- **Abelia grandiflora ‘Tres Amigos’** – New superior variegated Abelia for sunny gardens. Foliage will impress with greens, yellows, pinks and creams in spring, followed by more pink on tips over summer months. White flowers summer into fall, fragrant and attractive to hummers and insects alike. Grows to about 3’ tall and 5’ wide. Evergreen. Zone 6.
- **Arctostaphylos x ‘Pacific Mist’** – Super sun and drought tolerant Manzanita, grows about 2.5’ tall & spreads nicely to 8’ or so. Bluish green foliage, nice brownish red bark, white flowers late winter. Disease resistant variety perfect for waterwise gardens. Evergreen. Zone 7.
- **Aucuba japonica ‘Angelon’** – The striking large and spotted yellow foliage on this Aucuba from Europe is exquisite. Grows to about 5’ tall and wide. Perfect shrub for deep or part shade. This female variety flowers in late spring and produces showy red fruits in fall. Evergreen. Zone 6.
- **Azaleas** – Old Fashioned ones making a comeback! It is always fun to find some oldies but goodies to enjoy in the landscape. All these are evergreen, bloom in spring, are hardy to Zone 6 at minimum, and offer interesting flowers. Anchorite (4’ – pinky coral), Fairfax (3’- semi-double light pink/white), Hinodegiri (2’ - rose crimson), Ellie Harris (2’ – shell pink), Treasure (3’ – white), Congo (3’ – large purple), and Hino Tsukasa (3’ – large salmon) are a few of these that be around for spring 2023 planting.

- **Azalea x ‘Perfecto Mundo’ Series** – Exciting new hardier repeat blooming Azaleas that will offer color in spring and then AGAIN from mid-summer into fall as well. Available in double white, double pink and double purple. Grows about 3’ tall and 3’ wide with a tidy shape. Evergreen. Zone 6.
- **Buddleia Butterfly Candy Series ‘Lil’ Coconut’** – A cute little butterfly bush growing to 3’ and sporting white fragrant flowers all summer long, with more colors to come soon. Loves the sun, drought tolerant and best in well-drained soil. Perfect for pollinators and of course butterflies. Cut back hard to spring to rejuvenate each season. Deciduous. Zone 5.
- **Buddleia ‘Chrysalis Series’** – A few colors are available in this compact growing series. Plants stay about 3’ tall/wide and love sunny well-drained gardens. Drought tolerant and perfect for long summer fragrant flowers which attract all pollinators. Cut back hard each spring. Deciduous. Zone 5.
- **Camellia sasanqua ‘Autumn Rocket’** – This fabulous new Camellia will be available starting late summer 2023. Unique columnar variety that grows 10’ tall and 4’ wide. Pink buds open to pure white flowers with yellow stamens. Blooms late fall into winter. Best in part shade but will take full sun as well. Evergreen. Zone 7.
- **Daphne odora ‘Banana Split’** – Striking new variegated winter Daphne that sports delicious fragrant light pink blooms in February to April. Bold yellow leaf margins. Best in part shade and must have good drainage. Grows to 4’ tall and wide. Evergreen. Zone 7.
- **Daphne odora ‘Sweet Amethyst’** – Nice new Daphne with pinky purple super fragrant flowers in late winter through mid-spring. Bright green foliage and bushy habit growing to 3’ tall and 3’ wide. Needs good drainage and thrives in locations from full sun to part shade. Evergreen. Zone 7.
- **Euonymus japonicus ‘Paloma Blanco’** – Tidy dwarf variety with deep green foliage highlighted with pure white new growth every spring. Quite striking, perfect for tight little hedges and containers as well. Grows 2’ x 2’ and is easy to prune. Best in sun or part shade. Evergreen. Zone 6.
- **Forsythia x ‘Spring Fling’** – New variety from Bailey Nursery’s First Editions breeding program noted for large flowers and heavy bloom. Reddish burgundy fall color. Grows best in full sun or part shade to 6’ tall and wide. Early bright yellow flowers are perfect to welcome the coming spring weather. Easy to prune back after bloom. Deer resistant. Deciduous. Zone 5.
- **Hydrangea arborescens ‘Invincibelle Sublime’** - Good dwarf-ish full sun variety from Proven Winners growing about 5’ tall and wide. Large limey green repeat blossoms come all summer through fall and pop against dark green foliage. Cut back in early spring. Excellent cut flower. Deciduous. Zone 3.
- **Hydrangea aspera ‘Burgundy Bliss’** – Beautiful specimen size Hydrangea for part shade garden locations. Grows to about 8’ tall and wide. Nice summer blooms on old wood, but this one is about the fabulous purplish new foliage that fades to deep green in summer but remains purple underneath. Very striking. Deciduous. Zone 7.
- **Hydrangea ‘Let’s Dance Can Do!’** – New member of Let’s Dance Series from Proven Winners. Great for partial shade growing about 4’ tall and side. Repeat flowering and unique - blooms are lacecap form and lavender in our soil, appearing all along the stems and not just on top! Super hardy and easy to grow. Bright red purple fall color. Deciduous. Zone 4.
- **Hydrangea ‘Let’s Dance Sky View!’** - Another new member of the Let’s Dance Series from Proven Winners. Repeat flowering and tidy, growing to about 3’ tall and wide. Blooms all summer into fall. Great for pots, nice sky blue color in our acidic soils with greenish eye (or pinkish in alkaline soils). Super hardy buds and earlier blooming. Best in partial shade. Deciduous. Zone 4.

- **Hydrangea macrophylla ‘Kimono’** - Another excellent variety with tidy growth to 3’ tall and wide for partial shade. Repeat blooms all summer through fall on new and old wood. Red/white bicolor flowers and burgundy maroon foliage add interest. Cut back early spring if needed. Deciduous. Zone 5.
- **Hydrangea macrophylla ‘Love’** – Charming variety with unusual double flowers and compact habit. Grows to about 3’ tall and 4’ wide in partial shade. Starts early summer and repeat flowers through fall. Pink in alkaline soils, blue in acidic ones. Deciduous. Zone 4.
- **Hydrangea macrophylla ‘Magical Green Cloud’** - Bred for the floral industry, these huge green flowers white eyes are stunning. Sturdy stems on this old wood bloomer. Grows to 4’ tall & is best in partial shade. Flowers age into fiery red tomes in fall. Deciduous. Zone 5.
- **Hydrangea macrophylla ‘Pop Star’** – The latest and greatest intro from Bailey Nursery’s Endless Summer Collection. Repeat lacecap flowers from late spring until frost, color blue/acidic or pink/alkaline. Super tidy and compact habit, perfect for small spaces and container growing in part shade. Cut back if needed in early spring. Deciduous. Zone 4.
- **Hydrangea paniculata ‘Lavalamp Flare’** – Compact grower for full sun reaching 3’ tall and wide. Blooms all summer on new wood, thus easy to prune back each spring. Large panicle flowers open pure white and turn to bright red/pink as they age. Deciduous. Zone 3.
- **Hydrangea paniculata ‘Puffer Fish’** – A great new PG from Proven Winners for full sun and long summer bloom. Grows to about 5’ tall and wide. Heavy blooming variety with white panicles that turn greenish, not pink/red like others. Blooms on new wood and is easy to prune. Deciduous. Zone 3.
- **Hydrangea paniculata ‘Quick Fire Fab’** – Awesome larger growing PG for full sun and specimen size. Grows about 8’ tall and 6’ wide. Blooms on new wood for easy pruning and repeats into fall. Starts blooming late spring (early for PG) producing huge flowers turning pink then red as summer progresses. A “Fab”ulous choice for sure! Deciduous. Zone 3.
- **Hydrangea paniculata ‘Yuki Gessho’** – Rare and unusual PG variety from Japan with striking variegated foliage. Large grower to about 8’ tall and wide. Panicle blooms are white all summer into fall, turns pink tones as they age. Best with a little shade for the best foliage color. Resists deer, perfect bright foliage for the woodland garden. Deciduous. Zone 3.
- **Hydrangea serrata ‘Pink Dynamo’** – Sweet new hardy mountain variety growing only 3’ tall and wide. Repeat flowers all summer into fall - hot pink (alkaline) or bold blue (acidic) colors, deep purplish foliage adds interest. Tidy and super hardy. Best in part shade to full sun. Deciduous. Zone 5.
- **Hydrangea serrata ‘Tiny Tuff Stuff’** - Dwarf variety from Proven Winners staying only 2’ tall and wide. Repeat lacecap flowers all summer into fall. Awesome dwarf for landscape or container use, blue (acidic) or pink flower (alkaline). Super hardy and excellent fall color. Best in sun or part shade. Deciduous. Zone 5.
- **Hydrangea serrata ‘Tuff Stuff Ah-Ha’** - Compact grower to 3’ tall and wide. Repeat bloomer and super bud hardy for reliable early color. Double lacecap flowers can be blue or pink depending on soil pH, starting in summer and going through fall till frost. Grows best in part sun to full sun. Excellent fall color bonus. Deciduous. Zone 5.
- **Ilex crenata ‘Luxus Globe’** - Super versatile Japanese Holly that is male, with no berries ever. Tidy and formal growing only 2’ tall and wide with perfect globe shape. Great boxwood substitute with no disease and deep green color. Versatile in shade, part sun and full sun as well. Evergreen. Zone 6.
- **Ilex x ‘Ruby Colonnade’** – Easy shrub with pyramidal form growing to 10’ tall and 6’ wide. Shear to control to any size. Dark green color with purplish red tip growth adds interest. Makes great sun or part sun hedge plant or specimen. Evergreen. Zone 7.

- **Physocarpus opufolius ‘Lucky Devil’** - New ninebark from Bailey Nursery’s First Editions breeding program. Bright golden yellow foliage spring and summer, then glows orange in fall. White button flowers in late spring. Holds color nicely in part sun to full sun. Tidy and compact to 4’ tall and wide. Peeling bark adds winter interest. Deciduous. Zone 3.
- **Physocarpus opufolius ‘Spicy Devil’** – New ninebark from Bailey Nursery’s First Edition breeding program. Golden orange spring foliage turns to reddish purple for the summer – a spectacular foliage display. White button flowers in late spring. Peeling bark, fun in winter months. Nice specimen in full sun/part shade. Grows to 4’ tall and wide. Deciduous. Zone 3.
- **Pittosporum ten. ‘Gold Coast’** – Beautiful variety with lime green/yellow variegated foliage & dark stem color. Striking garden specimen from the land down under for sun or part shade. Grows to about 10’ tall and 8’ wide but can be pruned as needed in spring. Evergreen. Zone 7.
- **Prunus laurocerasus ‘Volcano’** – New variety of Cherry English Laurel that is compact and hardy. Coppery red new growth adds interest in spring and summer. Grows to about 7’ tall and 5’ wide but can be clipped to size and used as either a hedge or specimen plant. Salt tolerant as well. Evergreen. Zone 5.
- **Raphiolepis indica ‘Oriental Pearl’** – Super drought tolerant and low-maintenance shrub for sunny hot areas. Grows only 3’ tall and 4’ wide. White flowers in the summer heat. Foliage is more resistant to leaf spot in our wet climate. Evergreen. Zone 8.
- **Rhododendron ‘Black Widow’** – New at Sunnyside, this super dark blackish red bloomer is unique. Compact growth to 3’ tall and 4’ wide. Blooms mid-spring. Best in partial shade. Hardy to -5 degrees F. Evergreen.
- **Rhododendron ‘Coastal Spice’** – Sweet newer Rhody with pinky white flowers in early-mid spring. Dark green foliage is handsome, and growth tops out a 5’ tall and wide or so. Best in partial shade. Evergreen. Hardy to 5 degrees F.
- **Rhododendron ‘Dark Lord’** – Deep burgundy red flowers show up in mid-spring on this beauty. Grows best in partial shade, eventually to about 6’ tall and wide. Nice habit and great flower color. Evergreen. Hardy to Zone 5.
- **Rhododendron ‘Kaitlyn’s Delight’** – Bright orangey coral flowers are striking in mid-spring. Compact growth to 3’ tall and 4’ wide and best in partial shade. Evergreen. Hardy to 5 degrees F.
- **Rhododendron ‘Lem’s Tangerine’** – Bring back some old school Lem hybrids please! Glowing Orangey pink flowers come in late spring. Upright and open habit to about 4’ tall and wide. Best in partial sun. Evergreen. Hardy to -5 degrees F.
- **Rhododendron ‘Ramini’** – Golden flowers with pinky-orange glow are very nice. Compact habit to 3’ tall and a little wider perfect for small garden spots in partial sun. Evergreen. Hardy to Zone 5.
- **Rhododendron ‘Superflimmer’** – THE BEST of the variegated Rhodys for sure! Heavy yellow color on dark green really pops. Lilac purple flowers bloom in mid-spring. Strong grower to about 4’ tall & wide, best in partial sun where foliage can glow. Evergreen. Zone 6.
- **Sambucus ‘Laced Up’** – A revolutionary new elderberry from Proven Winners with columnar habit and dark purple black lacey foliage. Bright pink flowers each spring on old wood is a bonus. Grows to about 10’ tall and only 4’ wide. Growth habit perfect for height in sunny gardens without much spread. Will produce berries if another variety is present. Deciduous. Zone 4.

- **Spiraea japonica ‘Butterscotch Baby’** – Exceptional compact habit and color sets this one from Monrovia Growers apart. Carmel color foliage in both spring and fall. Summer is about bright green foliage with pink flowers over a long season attracting pollinators. Grows only 18” tall and 2’ wide, perfect for sunny garden small spaces. Deciduous. Zone 4.
- **Spiraea ‘Poprocks Petite’** – Bright candy pink flowers pop over bright green foliage. Blooms over a long season, mid-spring through summer. Tidy & compact growing, only 3’ tall/wide & easy to shear. Orange red fall color. Takes some wet as well. Deciduous. Zone 3.
- **Syringa vulgaris ‘Aucubifolia’** – Old school lilac with yellow variegated foliage and fragrant lavender/blue flowers in May/June. Nice grower to 10’ tall and wide or so, and can be grown as a multi-trunk shrub or trained into a small tree. Best in full sun and well drained soil. Prune after bloom to control size. Deciduous. Zone 3.
- **Weigela ‘Electric Love’** – A striking newer shrub sporting bronzy green leaves and lipstick red tubular flowers. Compact growth to 2’ tall and 3’ wide. Flowers attract pollinators and hummers alike. Blooms late spring into summer. Nice fall color. Deciduous. Zone 4.
- **Weigela ‘Tuxedo’** – Unique color on this one – purplish black foliage and white tubular flowers. Blooms late spring into summer and attracts pollinators. Excellent choice for full sun/part shade location in the landscape. Grows to about 5’ tall and wide. Good fall color is a bonus. Deciduous. Zone 4.
- **Weigela florida ‘Coco Chill’** – Exquisite dark black purple foliage spring and summer. Hot pink tubular flowers in late spring to summer attract pollinators and hummers alike. Grows only 3’ tall and wide and is super hardy. Best in fall sun for best color. Deciduous. Zone 4.
- **Weigela florida ‘Very Fine Wine’** – New variety from Proven Winners that is super easy to grow and attracts many pollinators and hummingbirds when in bloom. Dark purplish foliage all season with hot pink trumpet flowers in late spring/early summer. Super compact growth habit to only 2.5’ tall and wide. Deciduous. Zone 4.

In Perennials...

- **Agastache ‘Meant to Bee Series’** – These taller growing (up to 3’) Hyssops come in a few colors and make quite a statement. Fragrant foliage and long blooming from mid-summer through fall. Plant in a sunny, well-drained location and enjoy. Attract pollinators and hummers all summer long. Deer and Rabbit resistant. Zone 5.
- **Agastache ‘Poquito Butter Yellow’** – Tight new Hyssop growing only 12” tall and 15” wide. Likes full and great drainage. Flowers start in spring and go all the way through fall, attracting pollinators of all kinds. Fragrant foliage a bonus. Perfect addition to any sunny border or container. Deer and Rabbit resistant. Zone 5.
- **Anemone ‘Elfin Swan’** – New member of the “Swan Series” – useful anemones coming out of Scotland. White flowers backed with violet blue begin blooming in June and continue into fall – much earlier and longer than others. Grows best in woodland/shade gardens and will reach about 18” in height each season. Deer and Rabbit resistant. Zone 5.
- **Astilbe ‘Dark Side of the Moon’** – Striking new Astilbe from Proven Winners. Foliage emerges yellowish with dark edges and matures to a rich dark chocolate purple. Grows into clumps about 2’ tall and 3’ wide, producing rosy-purple flowers starting early summer. Likes some water and is perfect in sun (with water) or shade. Resists Deer and Rabbits. Zone 4.

- **Clematis ‘Vancouver Series’** – This fabulous series of Clematis out of Clearview in BC continues to add worthy flavors for our gardens. ‘Daybreak’ (large purplish with white striping), ‘Deborah Dahl’ (large lavender w/red stamens), and ‘Sea Breeze’ (wavy lavender and longer blooming May to Oct.) are new for 2023. Others bloom May/June on old wood, then repeat in August/September on new wood. All grow in the 6 to 8 foot range and need support like trellis, fence, post or arbor. Give good sun and well drained location. Pruning group B on these. Zone 4.
- **Comptonia peregrine** – Commonly called “Sweet Fern”, this fern-like deciduous shrub offers durability and excellent foliage. New at Sunnyside 2023, this plant tolerates poor soils, seashore conditions, slopes and even drought once established. Great for shade and part shade garden locations sporting fern like foliage. Grows to 3 to 4 feet tall and 8 feet wide, as the colony develops with age. Does not transplant well once established. Zone 2.
- **Crocsmia x ‘Sunlover’** – Bright new variety that shows shades of orange, yellow and pink all mixed into one. These love sun and good drainage, and will attract pollinators to the garden – especially hummingbirds and butterflies. These will naturalize and form a nice patch as they grow from rhizomes. Grows to about 2’ tall, perfect border plant. Zone 6.
- **Delosperma cooperi ‘Early Bird Purple’** – New flavor of hardy ice plant for sunny/hot dry garden locations where drought tolerance is needed. First series of ice plant that will open in the morning and not wait until mid-day. Heavy with purple blooms in the early summer and then sporadically into fall. Grows only 4” and forms tidy mounds. Perfect for slopes, rockeries, even spilling out of containers. Give good drainage. Evergreen in milder winters. Zone 6.
- **Dianthus American Pie Series ‘Berry A La Mode’** – Stunning new member of the series with super fragrant classic carnation white flowers with magenta eye in center. Blooms late spring summer and will repeat if deadheaded as well. Tidy blue green foliage mounds to about 12” tall and a little wider. Best in sunny, well drained soil. Evergreen in mild winters, Zone 5.
- **Dianthus ‘Paint the Town Series’** – New series from Proven Winners available in numerous colors like magenta, red, and fuchsia. Fragrant blooms start late spring and repeat through summer. Bluish foliage is a nice bonus. Best in well drained sunny borders, and is tolerant of salt and drought. Evergreen in our mild winters. Grows to only 8” tall and 12” wide. Zone 4.
- **Echinacea ‘Fine Feathered Parrot’** – Striking coneflower with red/orange center radiating out into yellows – very unique. Loves sun and well-drained soil and attracts pollinators all summer long. Grows to about 24” tall and 18” wide with upright habit. Deadhead your flowers to keep blooming, but leave the last ones for the birds. Zone 5.
- **Echinacea Fresco Series ‘Apricot’** – Large frilly apricot colored flowers all summer into fall. A bit more narrow and upright growing, but still loves the sunny well drained locations. Attracts pollinators and resists deer. Grows to about 30” tall and 18” wide. Drought tolerant. Zone 4.
- **Echinacea Sunny Days ‘Ruby’** – Spectacular new double flowering ruby coneflower that blooms summer into fall. Great for pollinators and resistant to deer. Clumping habit to 2’ tall and wide. Thrives in sunny well drained locations. Zone 4.
- **Epimedium x ‘Pretty in Pink’** – Bishop’s Cap is the ideal drought tolerant ground cover plant for deep shade. Early spring brings two toned pink blossoms, followed by bronzy green spring foliage and crisp green in summer. Evergreen in mild winters but can be cut back each February to start over if needed. Grows to about 1’ tall and spreads slowly to 3’. Will naturalize easily with tree roots and other plants as an understory plant. Deer and Rabbit resistant is a bonus. Zone 5.

- **Gaura ‘Gambit Variegated Pink’** – New variety of Gaura for attracting butterflies and pollinators. Light pink flowers are born above variegated foliage from early summer into fall. Nice bushy habit for sunny well drained borders. Nice addition to borders or even as a container specimen. Zone 5.
- **Geranium ‘Black and White’** – Stunning Cranesbill Geranium from our friends in the UK. Super cool almost black foliage that pops the silver white flowers in late spring to early summer. A worthy addition to a sun/part shade border for both color and bloom. Clumps grow to about 14” tall and 18” wide. Zone 3.
- **Hakonechloa macra ‘Lemon Zest’** – A Japanese Forest Grass with unique variegation – both ivory white and lemon yellow. Super foliage color to brighten up shady gardens. Consider planting a few to add color and sound/motion to the shade garden. Turns to pinky red in fall before going dormant. Clumps grow to about 1’ tall and 2’ wide and spreads slowly with time. Zone 5.
- **Hedychium coccineum ‘Mishimi Fire’** – A sweet hardy ginger that will bring some tropical touch to your garden. Big bold foliage will reach 3’ tall and wide, and fragrant orangey flowers that come in mid-late summer with the heat of summer. Plant in sunny area and can even thrive at the edges of ponds. Grows from Rhizome that can be overwintered indoors if needed, but hardy to Zone 7.
- **Heliopsis ‘Bit of Honey’** – False Sunflower with white variegated foliage, for added interest, from Proven Winners. Loves sunny, well drained garden spots and will reach about 30” tall and wide with clumping form. Semi-double golden yellow flowers start mid-summer and continue into fall, especially with some dead heading. Pollinator friendly. Zone 4.
- **Heuchera ‘Balboa Sunset’** – Tidy little coral bell that stays only 8” tall & 12” wide. Great purplish green foliage with wine red undersides. Nice border plant for sun & excellent container choice. Short flower stalks all season long & attracts pollinators. Evergreen. Zone 4.
- **Heuchera ‘Sienna Sunrise’** – Another tidy little coral bell reaching only 8” tall and 18” wide. Gray-green foliage with orange, bright pink undersides on wavy leaves. Perfect for tight spots and container interest. Short flower stalks come all season long and attract pollinators. Evergreen. Zone 4.
- **Heuchera ‘Timeless Glow’** – New Coral Bell from Proven Winners. Bright chartreuse green to yellow foliage perfect to brighten up a border or container in partial shade. Hot pink blooms are very showy all season and attract pollinators. Grows to 16” tall and 18” wide in clumps. Evergreen. Zone 4.
- **Heuchera ‘Timeless Night’** – New Coral Bell from Proven Winners. Dark black to purple foliage in full sun with rosy red flowers that attract pollinators all season. Grows to about 12” tall and 18” across. Evergreen. Zone 4.
- **Hibiscus ‘Summerific Series’** – The perennial type hibiscus are available in a number of flavors, offering any gardener the color of their choice. Impressive plants bloom in our area in the heat of summer. Flowers can be in the 8” to 9” range, almost dinner plate size! Foliage can be green or purplish black. They need full sun and well-drained soil. Plants can be 3’ to 6’ depending on the flavor. Keep them fed and watered for sure. Resist deer. Zone 4.
- **Hosta ‘Dancing Queen’** – Exquisite bright yellow Hosta for full or partial shade. Color does not fade until later summer when the lavender flower stalks emerge. Textured and wavy large leaves resist slugs and are certain to add color to any shade garden. Grows to about 18” tall and 30” wide with age. Zone 3.
- **Hosta ‘Dream Queen’** – Large thick bluish green foliage with creamy yellow variegation in center. Textured and more sun tolerant than many. White flower stalks emerge early summer. Grows to about 18” tall and 30” wide with age. Zone 3.

- **Hosta ‘Shadowland Autumn Frost’** – Medium sized bluish foliage with wide yellow variegated margins. Variegation fades to creamy white in summer as the lavender flower stalks emerge. Excellent color for the shade or partial shade garden. Grows to about 16” tall and 24” wide. Zone 3.
- **Hosta ‘Shadowland Wu-La-La’** – One of largest Hostas, this one is a specimen that will reach 4’ tall and 6’ wide! Giant blue green leaves are uniquely edged in an apple green. Awesome choice for the shade or partial shade garden. Violet flower stalks in mid-late summer. Give this one some time to mature and you will be impressed! Zone 3.
- **Kniphofia ‘Rocket Junior’** – The tidiest red hot poker to date, grassy foliage grows only 12” tall and 9” wide with flower spikes reaching 16” tall. Hot orange/red/yellow flowers start in early summer and continue into fall attracting pollinators of all kinds. Loves sun and drainage. Ideal for sunny borders and containers. Zone 6.
- **Lavandula angustifolium ‘Vintro Blue’** – Super hardy and more tolerant of wet winter weather is just what we need! Loves sun and well-drained soil. Fragrant foliage and flowers can be cut and used indoors as well. Repeating violet flowers start late spring and continue into fall. Shear to keep extra tight, but will stay tidy at 18” tall and 18” wide or so. Drought tolerant, deer and rabbit resistant. Zone 5.
- **Leucanthemum x superbum Western Star ‘Gemini’** – New Shasta Daisy with large flowers that open creamy yellow and fade into white as they age. Long bloom season late spring through summer, perfect for pollinator friendly gardens. Compact habit with dense foliage growing to 18” tall and 24” wide. Loves sun and well-drained soil. Zone 4.
- **Lupinus ‘Mini Gallery Series’** – Hybrid Lupines available in a number of different colors from Proven Winners. Compact growth to 16” tall & 9” wide or so. Loves sunny pollinator friendly gardens and well-drained soil, also makes a sweet container specimen. Blooms heavily beginning early summer. Plant a few colors for a spectacular show! Zone 4.
- **Monardella ‘Marian Simpson’** – Super drought tolerant California native that is perfect for hot dry areas with excellent drainage. Happy tucked into lean soil, rockeries and slopes. Variety is more resilient in our wet spring than species. Blooms red tubular flowers in the heat of summer, favorite of pollinators especially Hummingbirds. Forms a tidy mat of foliage about 4” tall and 12” wide. Deer Resistant and evergreen. Zone 6.
- **Musa basjoo ‘Mekong Giant’** – Go bold and tropical with some huge foliage! These hardier fiber bananas will develop trunks and may reach up to 15’ in our climate. May die to ground in colder winters, but trunks can be insulated/mulched through winter allowing plant to attain tree structure. Trunks will get some purplish color with age as well. Roots hardy to Zone 6.
- **Ophiopogon plan. ‘Pam Harper’** – Cool variegated form of the popular mondo grass for use in shade or part shade garden spots as well as shady containers. Striking creamy yellow variegation adds interest. Lavender flower spikes in summer followed by shiny berries. Grows into clumps & spreads, about 9” tall & 18” wide. Deer & rabbit resistant. Evergreen. Zone 7.
- **Panicum virgatum ‘Prairie Dog’** – Shorter and sturdier flavor of switch grass that holds up well in wet areas. Super drought tolerant and easy. Clumping habit to about 4’ tall and 2’ wide. Great specimen or planted in mass. Blue-green foliage turns rusty orange red in fall. Seeds attractive to birds. Cut back in early spring to start over each season. Zone 4.
- **Penstemon ‘Flock of Flamingos’** – New pink long blooming beardtongue, a favorite of pollinators in sunny well drained gardens and sunny containers. Grows to about 36” tall and 18” wide with large flower stalks. Blooms over a long season, from mid-summer into fall. Deer resistant. Zone 6.

- **Peony Itoh ‘Pink Ardor’** – Large bright semi-double hot pink flowers with yellow stamens. Itoh peonies are sturdy & do not require staking, plants reach about 2’ tall & wide. Easy for sun or part shade garden locations & well-drained soil. Nice foliage color in fall as well. Zone 4.
- **Peony lactiflora ‘Gardenia’** – Extremely fragrant cottage peony with light pink buds opening into large double 6” to 8” white flowers. Excellent for cutting and bringing indoors. Flowers in late spring early summer. Loves sun/part shade and adequate drainage. Will reach about 3’ tall and wide with age. Stake or cage for support. Deer and rabbit resistant. Zone 3.
- **Phlox ‘Flame Series’** – New garden phlox series available in colors like Lilac Star, Pro White, Red and Watermelon. Super compact habit to 16” tall and wide – perfect for containers and sunny well drained borders. Some mildew resistance as well. Fragrant flowers appear in summer and attract pollinators of all kinds. Zone 3.
- **Phlox ‘Opening Act Series’** – New garden phlox series from Proven Winners with superior mildew resistance and earlier flowering. Available in a number of colors all of which attract pollinators of all kinds. Good choice for sunny borders and containers. Grows about 20” tall and wide. Zone 4.
- **Phlox ‘Rocky Road Series’** – New series of moss phlox available in colors like magenta, blue, and pink. These April/May bloomers stay compact, growing to only 6” to 12” tall and 12” to 18” wide. Good drainage is essential. These are perfect for sunny rockeries, slopes, borders and as a container spiller. Zone 3.
- **Polemonium ‘Golden Feathers’** – This Jacob’s Ladder from Proven Winners boasts sumptuous gold/green variegated foliage. Sure to add color and texture to the shade or partial shade garden. Excellent choice for shady container accent as well. Purplish flowers bloom late spring into summer. Tidy mounding habit growing to 8” tall and 12” wide. Deer and rabbit resistant. Zone 5.
- **Sedum ‘Spot On Series’** – Extremely floriferous series of ground cover sedums available in specific colors. Drought tolerant for all full sun areas including slopes and containers. Grows to about 6” tall and spreads slowly to 18” wide. Vibrant flowers are pollinator magnets all summer long. Evergreen. Zone 4.
- **Sedum spurium ‘Little Gecko’** – Short creeping sedum with variegated foliage. Perfect for sunny slopes, containers & other spots with good drainage. Loves sun & super drought tolerant once established. White summer flowers attract pollinators. Evergreen. Zone 4.
- **Tricyrtis formosana ‘Ninja Star’** – Unique combination of sweet variegation on foliage and intricate spotted flowers for the woodland garden. Flowers appear mid-summer into fall. A must have for any shade/part shade/filtered light garden combining with ferns, Hostas and other perennials. Clumps grow to 18” tall and 36” wide with age. Zone 5.

In Conifers...

- **Abies koreana ‘Wellenseind’** – One of smallest Korean Firs for the avid collector. A truly miniature globe-shaped specimen growing just an inch or two a year and reaching about 18” tall and wide with age. Loves sun and good drainage – perfect for small spaces, slopes and rock gardens. Zone 4.
- **Abies procera ‘Blaue Hexe’** – A small and tidy Noble Fir with good texture and blue color. Forms a compact spreading plant about 18” tall and 2’ wide, growing only 2” inches a year. Best in sun and soil with adequate drainage. Excellent choice for rock gardens, small spaces, and any other sunny spot where a cool conifer can be enjoyed year around. Zone 5.

- **Calocedrus decurrens ‘Berrima Gold’** – A spectacularly colored Incense Cedar bred in the land down under. Super fragrant foliage and bright yellow color, even turning a touch orange in the colder winter months. Slower growing than species, eventually reaching about 10’ x 4’, even larger with age. Tidy more columnar like habit. Zone 6.
- **Calocedrus decurrens ‘Maupin Glow’** – A nice yellow variegated form of Incense Cedar found near Deschutes, Oregon. Nice tidy habit reaching about 15’ tall and 5’ wide with age. Upper portions glow yellow in sun, more bright green in some shade. Tolerant of most soils. Fragrant foliage and grows about 8” a year or so. Zone 6.
- **Chamaecyparis noot. ‘Sparkling Arrow’** - Striking newer cultivar of Weeping Alaskan Cedar with yellow variegated sections that pop against the green base color. Will grow into magnificent narrow weeping conifer about 25’ tall & only 6’ wide. Ultimate combination of color & character. Loves sunny locations & well-drained soil. Grows up to 12” a year. Zone 5.
- **Chamaecyparis obtusa ‘Night Light’** - Excellent Hinoki variety with rich yellow color in sun. Very wind and sun tolerant. A good choice for both a garden specimen or as a windbreak or even clipped hedge. Grows slowly to 5’ tall and wide, but can achieve 20’ plus size if left unpruned. Loves sunny, well drained locations and is drought tolerant. Zone 5.
- **Cryptomeria japonica ‘Dragon Prince’** – Extremely low maintenance conifer choice that tolerates hot and dry locations. Great texture on foliage, bright two tone green all year long. Tidy dwarf shape growing to only 3’ tall and 4’ wide. A very worthy Japanese Cedar for PNW gardens. Zone 6.
- **Cryptomeria japonica ‘Dragon Warrior’** - A new Japanese Cedar with a more irregular form that adds character. Eventually forms a pyramidal plant about 6’ tall and 4’ wide. Best in sunny, well drained locations. Color is light green in spring, darker in summer, then almost a black green in winter months. Zone 6.
- **Metasequoia glyptostroboides ‘Hamlet’s Broom’** – A modern variety of Dawn Redwood with tidy shape and color. The whitish variegation will brighten any spring garden, and rusty orange color in fall adds another interest. These deciduous conifers will display cool flaky bark all winter as well. Grows to about 8’ tall and 6’ wide. Best in partial shade, and will tolerate moist soils as well. Zone 5.
- **Picea pungens ‘Niemitz’** - A striking variety of Colorado Blue Spruce boasting blue color with creamy white new growth. Grows best in sunny dry locations to about 10’ tall and 8’ wide with age. Cool spruce with both color and some character as well. Zone 2.
- **Picea pungens ‘Ruby Teardrops’** – Dwarf Blue Spruce with unbelievable red growth tips! Grows slowly to about 3’ tall and 4’ wide, attaining a spreading globe shape with age. Outstanding form and color on this one, spectacular with ruby red color each spring on branch tips. Loves sun and well-drained soil. Zone 3.
- **Picea stichinensis ‘Silberzwerg’** – A dwarf form of our native Sitka Spruce for the modern garden. Forms a tight specimen about 8’ tall and 6’ wide. Nice mix of bluish green and silver color on needles. Super easy and hardy. Best in a sunny well drained location. Deer resistance is a bonus. Zone 5.
- **Pinus mugo ‘Pesto’** – New introduction from Iseli, a truly miniature Mugo Pine. Grows to only 1’ tall and 2’ wide with age. Candles can be sheared to keep even tighter. Nice bright green color all year around that hugs the ground and spreads slowly. Resists deer, is drought tolerant and super hardy to Zone 2.
- **Podocarpus nivalis ‘Jalako Red’** – Sweet new Alpine Totara variety with reddish purple stems and deep purple winter color. Drought tolerant and tidy growth to 2’ tall and 3’ wide with age. Best in sun or part shade. Evergreen. Zone 7.

- **Sciadopitys verticillata ‘Propeller’** - Sweet new Japanese Umbrella Pine with dense bushy habit and unique propeller like whorls of needles. Will grow about 6” a year and eventually reach about 6’ tall and 8’ wide with age. Excellent green color through all four seasons. Nice dense habit and great size for the modern smaller landscape. Zone 5.
- **Taxus ‘Goldener Zwerg’** – This English Yew offers bright yellow color each spring, fading into yellow with deep green in summer/fall/winter. Super tidy shape, growing to about 6’ tall and 3’ wide. Easy to prune as well. Great formal plant for pots or tight landscape locations. Does well in sun or part shade with adequate drainage. Zone 4.
- **Thuja occidentalis ‘Lemon Burst’** – New from the First Editions Program at Bailey Nursery, this Arborvitae is colorful and tidy. Grows to about 6’ tall and 4’ wide. Colorful Arborvitae that gets some orangey color in winter for added interest. Resistant to needle blight a bonus as well. Best in sun or part shade. Zone 4.
- **Thuja occidentalis ‘Planet Earth’** – Introduced from Bailey Nursery’s First Editions Program, this easy care Arborvitae may reach about 5’ tall and wide. Bright green color in the season, turning bronze in colder winter months. Best in sun or part shade. Perfect round balls without pruning! Resistance to needle blight is a bonus as well. Zone 4.
- **Tsuga diversifolia ‘Minikin’** – A dwarf variety of Japanese Hemlock for the collector. Interesting shape to about 6’ tall and 4’ wide. Versatile hemlock that can be pruned, and will thrive in full sun to shade as well. Bright silvery white undersides of needles add a bit of a shimmer to the plant. Zone 4.

In Edibles...

- **Almond ‘All-In-One’** – A superior hardy almond that is both self-fertile and delicious. Nuts are ready in September in our area. Showy spring flowers and nice fall colors as well. Grows to about 20’ tall and wide. Zone 5.
- **Apple ‘Spitzenburg’** – We are going old school here, like Thomas Jefferson old school, on this desirable heirloom apple. Often regarded as one of best desert apples ever, BUT is also great fresh off the tree. Needs a pollinator. Ripens in October. Good keeper as flavor increases with storage. Zone 5.
- **Asian Pear ‘Tsu Li’** – A fabulous heirloom Chinese Pear that is large, sweet and juicy. Ripens in October and needs a pollinator. Available in 2023 on semi-dwarf rootstock growing to about 15’ tall and wide. Speckled greenish yellow in color. Zone 5.
- **Asian Pear ‘Ya Li’** – Another fabulous heirloom Chinese Pear with large, sweet and spicy fruit in October. Needs a pollinator. Available in 2023 on semi-dwarf rootstock growing to about 15’ tall and wide. A little crisper like an apple. Zone 5.
- **Fig ‘Fignominal’** – Tidy new dwarf fig, perfect for container growing & small space gardening. Plants grow only 3’ tall & wide & love heat. Brown figs with pinky red flesh. Sweet figs are born over a long period, summer into fall. Protect in pots in cold winter spells. Zone 7.
- **Lonicera caerulea ‘Indigo Gem’** – Early blooming selection, needs another to cross-pollinate for best production. Honeyberries have excellent nutritional value and great flavor. Grows to about 4’ tall and wide. Best in fall sun. Ripens in June/July. Zone 3.
- **Peach ‘Salish Summer’ (Q-1-8)** – A promising newer, leaf curl resistant peach variety giving us a choice besides Frost Peach. Tasty white flesh & heavy bearing. Available on semi-dwarf rootstock in 2023, growing to about 15’ tall & wide. Ripens in September. Zone 4.
- **Vaccinium corymbosum ‘Huron’** – Newer highbush blueberry cultivar that is compact, growing to about 4’ tall. Early ripening season & needs another variety to cross pollinate. Large, super sweet dark blue berries. Excellent fall color. Tolerates some wet soils. Zone 4.

- **Walnut ‘Franquette’** – An heirloom Walnut new to Sunnyside. Nice late bloom avoids frost. Ripens in October. Best in sun and will grow to 40’ tall and wide with age. Be patient, they take a few years to bear. Good quality nuts that are easier than most to harvest. Zone 6.

In Annuals...

- **Begonia ‘Double Up Series’** – New series of double flowering Begonias from Proven Winners. Versatile for both sun or shade and blooms late spring until frost. Available in a few colors – all have nice foliage as well. Use for color in borders and in containers as well. Keep fertilized to maximize flowers all summer long. Zone 10.
- **Begonia ‘Holiday Series’** – The beauties combine nice flowers with WOW-factor foliage. They love deep shade and make nice additions to shade garden borders or containers. With fun names like “Holly Jolly”, “Silver Bells” or “New Year’s Eve”, celebrate all summer long. Keep fertilized to maximize color all summer long. Zone 8.
- **Begonia ‘Solenia’** – The perfect new Begonia for hanging baskets, blooming all along the stems for maximum flower power. Tolerates sun or part shade and mildew resistant. Plants grow about 12” tall and 24” wide in season. Available in a number of colors in 2023. Keep fertilized to maximize color all summer long. Zone 9.
- **Cordyline ‘Lime Passion’** – A superior new variegated Dracena with striking lime green/white striped foliage. The perfect centerpiece for a sunny container, or used to give that tropical feel in the landscape. Grows to about 5’ tall with age, but just 2’ or so as an annual. Zone 8.
- **Cuphea ‘Hummingbird Lunch’** – The name says it all on this one, an absolute hummingbird magnet all summer long. Hot colored totally tubular flowers keep on coming. Loves the heat and full sun, perfect for sunny gardens and containers. Grows roughly 2’ tall and 3’ wide. Keep fertilized from early summer until frost for maximum color. Zone 8.
- **Evolvus ‘Beach Bum Blue’** – Showy blue flowers open from May until frost. Compact shape about 6” tall and 12” wide. Perfect spiller plant for sunny containers and hanging baskets. A pollinator favorite. No deadheading needed. Keep fertilized for maximum bloom early summer until frost. Zone 9.
- **Mandevillea Coral Orange Sunrise** – Unique color on this tropical beauty. Coral-orange blooms all summer long in the heat. Add some support for a container centerpiece, or use it as a trailing plant in baskets. Keep fertilized all summer for best performance. Zone 9.
- **Mandevillea Opal Yellow** – Vibrant yellow selection of this heat loving annual vine. Will grow to 4’ or so, if given support. Useful as a container thriller or mixed in hanging baskets as well. Keep fertilized for maximum color early summer until frost. Zone 9.
- **Supertunias** – The sweet varieties of trailing Petunias keep on coming! These Proven Winner varieties are new at Sunnyside in 2023 - Blue Skies, Honey, Limoncello, and Snowdrift to name a few. We love these in baskets as they require no deadheading, love heat, and attract our pollinator friends. Go bold with some big ‘ol growing Petunias! Zone 9.
